ADMINISTRATIVE STUDIES

UCR's program in Administrative Studies is offered jointly by the College of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences and the A. Gary Anderson Graduate School of Management through the Business Administration program and the departments of

- **Art History**
- **Economics**
- **History**
- **Political Science**
- **Sociology**

The major leads to the **Bachelor of Arts degree for students in Art History, Economics, History and Political Science**, or to either a **Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology**.

Students can, through the Administrative Studies component of the major, gain an interdisciplinary approach to training in decision-making and analytical skills, while the cooperating departments provide a thorough grounding in their respective disciplines. The combination gives students a well-rounded



education that can lead directly to a variety of careers or to graduate studies.

Faculty are drawn from the cooperating departments and are renowned for both teaching and research.

Career Opportunities

Career paths vary wildly due to the interdisciplinary aspect of this program, but students who choose to add the Administrative Studies component to their major become uniquely qualified for executive, management and management trainee positions within their area of interest. Art History majors might seek curator or gallery owner positions. Economics majors may become lead analysts, managers or financial managers. History and political science majors might seek positions as curators or managers in fields as varied as journalism, human resources, media, or politics. Sociology majors would be well suited for management or executive positions in social service agencies, non-profit organizations, government agencies, educational institutions, hospitals, rehabilitation centers, and correctional institutions.

Undergraduate Research Opportunities

Students can participate in the undergraduate research offered by their cooperating departments and have access to department research facilities in those departments. One such research project investigated how Japanese immigrants have adapted in American society.
