

**Visiting Assistant Professor in Art History**

The Department of the History of Art at the University of California, Riverside expects to have a temporary part-time opening for a Visiting Assistant Professor during the 2017-2018 academic year, pending final budgetary approval. The salary for each course is approximately \$8,000. Courses listed below may vary in number and quarter of offering. M.A. and one year of teaching experience at the college or university level is required.

Teaching responsibilities will include one course of undergraduate instruction (upper-division) in Fall quarter, 2017, and one graduate-level course in Winter quarter, 2018. Other responsibilities include undergraduate advising and thesis review, meeting with graduate students, and some departmental service.

To ensure full consideration, applications and supporting material should be received by July 5, 2017.
