

**Visiting Assistant Professor in Asian Art History, 2018-2019**

The Department of the History of Art at the University of California, Riverside expects a temporary part-time opening for a visiting assistant professor during the 2018-2019 academic year, pending final budgetary approval. The salary for each course is approximately \$8,000. Courses listed below may vary in number and quarter of offering. M.A. and one year of teaching experience at the college or university level is required. Based on qualifications we may consider splitting the appointment between individuals. Review of applications will begin June 9, 2018, and continue until positions are filled.

Teaching responsibilities include one lower-division in Winter quarter, 2019, and one graduate-level course in Spring quarter, 2019; other responsibilities include advising students and participating in department service.
